Wedi ei seilio ar Matilda, hanes yw hi am ferch 5 mlwydd oed gyda'r gallu i ddefnyddio telekinesis. Mae hi'n mwynhau darllen ac yn medru goresgyn a rhwystrau a achosir gan ei theulu a'r ysgol ac mae hi'n medru llwyddo i helpu ei hathro i adennill ei bywyd.

Yn ystod diwrnod llawn hwyl ac egnïol, cafodd disgyblion eu cyflwyno i hanes "Matilda the Musical", y cymeriadau allweddol ynddi a'r broses greadigol o ddod a'r sioe yn fyw ar y llwyfan.

Roedd y gweithdai deinamig arbennig yn llawn egni ac yn cynnwys plant o bob oed, o 6 oed ac i fyny. Dysgodd y plant 'routine' gerddorol a dawns o'r sioe West End gwreiddiol. Derbyniodd y plant wersi o'r safon uchaf gan ennill hunan hyder ac ysbrydoliaeth drwy fedru cymryd rhan mewn dawns, drama a chanu.

Roedd hwn yn ddiwrnod unigryw ac anhygoel, ac ar y diwedd rhoddodd y plant berfformiad o flaen cynulleidfa o athrawon a gwahoddedigion arbennig.

Yn gynharach eleni, ymwelodd yr actores ac aelod cast, Katie Lee, a Ysgolion o fewn Sir Ddinbych fel rhan o Throsfeddiannu Ysgolion Sir Ddinbych a ysbrydolwyd gan Roald Dahl 2016.

Ever wondered what it would be like to take part in a musical theatre workshop taught by West End stars in your very own school? Well, following its success in Denbighshire Young Performer 2016 competition, that's exactly what happened when Ysgol Cefn Meiriadog, Denbighshire, North East Wales, was awarded its very own West End experience and opened its doors to actress and Royal Shakespeare Company practitioner, Hollie Taylor, direct from the Cambridge Theatre, London's hit "Matilda the Musical".

Based on the children's novel of the same name by Roald Dahl, "Matilda the Musical" is a stage musical, adapted by Dennis Kelly, with music and lyrics by Tim Minchin, and centres on Matilda, a precocious 5-year-old girl with the gift of telekinesis, who loves reading, overcomes obstacles caused by her family and school and helps her teacher to reclaim her life.

During a fun-filled and energetic day, students were introduced to the story of Matilda the Musical, the key characters and the creative process of bringing it to life on stage.

The highly energized and dynamic workshops involved children of all ages, from 6 years old and upwards, learning a routine, song and scene from the actual hit West End show. The children received the finest tuition and gained confidence and inspiration from participating in dance, drama and singing.

This was a unique and amazing day, concluding with a "performance moment" when the children performed aspects of their work to teachers and special invited guests.

This is the second time Denbighshire Education and Children's Services has collaborated with "Matilda the Musical", Cambridge Theatre, London. Earlier this year, actress and cast member, Katie Lee, visited Denbighshire Schools as part of Denbighshire Schools Takeovers inspired by Roald Dahl 2016.
